


PHILANTHROPY AND GROWING CHANGE-MAKERS OF TOMORROW.



IT'S EARTH DAY!

TO CELEBRATE THIS GLOBAL DAY FOCUSING ON THE IMPORTANCE OF PROTECTING AND PRESERVING OUR WORLD, WE'VE CREATED ENGAGING ACTIVITIES AND EXPERIENCES TO HELP STUDENTS LEARN MORE ABOUT HOW THEY CAN BE DRIVERS OF ENVIRONMENTAL CHANGE USING THEIR TIME, TALENT AND TREASURE.



Think of philanthropy like the lifecycle of a plant. For a plant to grow, a seed must be planted, roots must form, leaves must sprout, a flower is made that is then pollinated so that more seeds can be made. This cycle mirrors philanthropy! An idea is planted then small acts of giving are done to help the idea take root. Then through learning, we grow in our giving and start making a difference. We spread kindness to inspire others which helps us leave a legacy!







Tell your students that Earth Day is a holiday that over 1 billion people celebrate every year and today, they get to join in on the fun!

 Earth Day is about raising awareness about the importance of protecting our planet. It takes place on April 22 every year. This special day reminds us that we all need to be kind to Earth not only on this one day but all 365 days of the year. We want to keep our planet clean and healthy so that animals, plants and people can live happily together.


