MIDDLE SCHOOL PHILANTHROPY OBJECTIVES

Each Project Heart lesson provides intentional instruction and activities that are grade specific and developed to deepen students understanding and application of philanthropic principles.

LESSON	PHILANTHROPY OBJECTIVES
Lesson 1	What Does Philanthropy Mean in Your Life? - Students will connect philanthropy to their lives. Learners define the word "philanthropy" and describe what giving back looks like in their daily life and in their communities.
Lesson 2	How Can YOU Make a Difference with Your 3Ts? - Students choose a nonprofit and identify how that organization is creating solutions to address a need in the community or world. Learners identify and create strategies around how their 3Ts can help a local nonprofit in their community.
Lesson 3	Which Personal Passions Drive Your Mission? - Students dig deeper into their understanding of philanthropy. Learners identify their personal passions to create their own philanthropic mission statement.
Lesson 4	Impacting Others Locally, Nationally or Globally - Students will learn the framework needed to distinguish between local, national and global impacts of nonprofits. Using this framework, learners identify and share ways they can create their own impact.
Lesson 5	What is Your Plan to Make a Difference Now? - Students collaborate to design a flyer for an individual, group or class impact project. Learners apply new knowledge to utilize skills to create action ideas to make a difference.
Lesson 6	What is the End Goal for Positive Impact? - Students begin with the end in mind. Leaners create an end goal for the class project(s) that will make an impact on a local, national or global level.
Lesson 7	SMART Goals Improve Impact & Help You Persevere - Student will think critically as they compare and contrast philanthropic efforts. Leaners create SMART goals to improve the success of the project(s) and brainstorm ways to persevere despite obstacles.
Lesson 8	What Support Do I Need and Who Will Help? - Students will use their voice to tap into support from family, friends and peers. Learners synthesize project ideas and goals into a project plan with assigned tasks for gaining support from people and organizations.
Lesson 9	Executing Your Plan for Positive Impact - Students finish planning their projects. Learners are encouraged to document and record evidence of their philanthropic efforts.
Lesson 10	Celebrate and Continue Your Efforts - Students immerse themselves in reflective practice around being philanthropists.
